COVID-19 prevention leading to the future

Goal

Vaccination prevents the appearance of symptoms and severe symptoms of COVID-19

Vaccination is
FREE
(Paid through public funds)

Everyone **will** be vaccinated **twice**.
Don't worry, and wait for the notification.

Vaccination is
a duty of effort

You should take the time to understand the vaccine's effects and side effects before deciding to get it.



Keep up infection prevention measures even after vaccination!



Wear a mask



Wash your hands



Stay home



Keep your
distance



Follow coughing
etiquette

Prevaccination Timeline

1 Receive a medical history form and a vaccination ticket at home

They will be sent to the address on your certificate of residence; all you have to do is wait.



2 Reserve a spot after checking how to do so

Reservations required

You **must reserve** to get vaccinated! Do so **as soon as** you receive your vaccination ticket!

3 Go to the vaccination site on the day you reserved

What you will need:

3 things

Medical history form

Vaccination ticket

Proof of identity

Don't forget! You need them to get vaccinated!

If you have questions about reservations or vaccination sites, contact the city or town where your certificate of residence is registered.

Caution: Before Vaccination



You cannot be vaccinated if you have the following:

An obvious fever

A severe acute disease

An allergy*



* For example, if you have a history of allergic reactions to vaccines containing polyethylene glycol



You should be cautious in the following cases:

People receiving treatment for the following:

A heart condition

A kidney disease

A liver disease

A blood disease

Immuno-deficiency

Others

- People whose blood does not clot easily
- People who have had allergic reactions in the two days after being vaccinated in the past
- People who have suffered from convulsions

Point
Be sure to tell the person in charge of your vaccination!



Watch out for vaccination-related fraud

Cases of fraud where someone says you could get vaccinated faster and asks for money or personal information over the telephone or by email after claiming to be from the prefecture, or your city or town are increasing.

If you think something is fishy, contact the consumer's hotline at 188 (no area code) right away! (Japanese only)



Things to Watch Out for After Vaccination

Possible side effects in the few days after vaccination

Note: Side effects are more likely to appear after the second shot.

- Pain or swelling at the site ⌚ For 2 days from the day of
- Muscle or joint pain ⌚ For a day from the next day
- Headaches ⌚ For a day from the next day
- Fatigue, chills, fever ⌚ For a day from the next day



Tiredness, nausea, diarrhea or vomiting may also occur.

These symptoms **should disappear after a few days**
Just wait and keep checking your condition

In case of a high fever or strong pain

You may use over-the-counter fever-reducing pain relief medicine, but if you are worried, you should consult with **your doctor**, a **pharmacist or pharmacy staff**.
